3 Course Objectives/Learning Outcomes

This course examines more advanced programming concepts using the Java object-oriented programming language. Topics to be covered include major concepts of object-oriented design, inheritance, polymorphism, string/text processing, searching and sorting algorithms, recursion, exception handling and advanced file I/O, among others.

 - 4 assignments, evenly weighted

- 4. Final Exam (50%)
 - Should illness prevent participation in a test or examination, a medical certificate from a certified physician must be supplied before any adjustments are considered.
